4/09/18 6:30-8:30 pm	IT's SIDS	Mandatory training (within the first 2 months of employment) for "all providers" (including Directors, floaters and subs) licensed to work with infants 0-12 months. Certificate must be renewed every 3 years.	2 hrs	\$10
4/11/18 6:30-8:30 pm	Anti-Bullying and Teasing: How We Can Make a Difference!	Educators will learn, describe, and discuss (strategies) ways in which the teacher, director, family, community, and children can come together to encourage tolerance, respect, and kindness in the classroom and beyond; learn how to create a caring environment at school reducing the possibility that children will assert themselves (before it develops). Educators will receive and review activities and resources that focus on controlling it by cultivating friendship, community, positive feelings in which children can feel safe, comfortable, and welcomed. Review NC-FELD as it relates to Social/Emotional Development and Positive Interactions.	2 hrs	\$10

Educators will learn about how everyday artists can explore with open ended art material, learn ways of problem solving, conceptualizing the world, and creating new possibilities, suggestions of appropriate ways to support children's artistic expressions, explanations of how inquiry and creativity contribute to the overall thinking and learning of the young child, teaching strategies (incorporating NC FELD) for extending children's thinking and learning, and a wide range of ideas for teaching who feel they don't know how to "do" art.	2 hrs	\$10
4/23/18 8:30 am-1:30 pm	BSAC	BSAC (Basic School Age Care) is a 5-hour introductory level training event for school age care professionals that are new to the field. The training includes the following modules: 1) Health, Safety, & Nutrition, 2) Environmental Design, 3) Child/Youth Development 4) Developmentally Appropriate Activities, 5) Guiding Child Behavior, and 6) Quality School Age Care. This training is required by the NC Division of Child Development for school age care professionals working in licensed programs but is a great training for new staff in any afterschool program setting.	5 hrs	\$25
4/25/18 6:30-8:30 pm	Everyday Spanish in the Early Childhood Setting	This workshop will focus on "survival Spanish" strategies you can use and put to work immediately! You'll have the knowledge and vocabulary to communicate more effectively when working with children and families in your classroom.
