Tuesday 1/29/19 8:30 a.m.-until	CPR/FA	(CPR) Participants will learn lifesaving breathing techniques. (First Aid) Teaches critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives.	8 hours	\$75
Monday 2/4/19 6:30-8:30 pm	IT'S SIDS	Mandatory training (within the first 2 months of employment) for "all providers" (including Directors, floaters and subs) licensed to work with infants 0-12 months. Certificate must be renewed every 3 years.	2 hours	\$10
Wed./Thurs. 2/6/19 & 2/7/19 6-8:30 pm	Challenging Behaviors: Causes, Prevention, and Intervention Strategies Parts 1&2 (for all ages)	Understanding the reasons why a child engages in a challenging behavior is crucial to choosing a response which will successfully change the behavior. Once you can identify the meaning of the challenging behavior, you can identify a plan to change it. If you know a recipe is too bland, you can add some spice; if all of you know is that it's not right, there's not much you can do about it. Come learn about functional behavior assessments, the three essential parts of any plan for addressing challenging behaviors, and a variety of intervention strategies you can use to respond to challenging behaviors. Monday 2/11/19 8:30 am- 1:30 pm	BSAC (for afterschool teaching staff only)	BSAC (Basic School Age Care) is a 5-hour introductory level training event for school age care professionals that are new to the field. The training includes the following modules: 1) Health, Safety, & Nutrition, 2) Environmental Design, 3) Child/Youth Development 4) Developmentally Appropriate Activities, 5) Guiding Child Behavior, and 6) Quality School Age Care. This training is required by the NC Division of Child Development for school age care professionals working in licensed programs but is a great training for new staff in any afterschool program setting.	5 hours	\$25
