During this presentation, attendees will learn to identify the markers of sensory reminders that leave individuals with feelings of anxiety, unease, or even panic. Attendees will learn the difference between what we casually call triggers and having mental health symptoms. This includes examples of "triggers" and what the individual can do when "triggered". This will be done through language used by Circle of Security International, regarding how the individual reacts and then responds to anything that activates certain types of physical symptoms and how to resettle the nervous system, without suppressing it.
