It is the intent of the NC DCDEE to severely limit the use of these exclusionary practices in early childhood education programs. This informational meeting will acquaint facility administrators/owners with NC's new Suspension/Expulsion Policy, explore the importance of promoting healthy social-emotional development in preventing the challenging behaviors which often lead to suspension/expulsion. In this high energy session, we will discuss common issues teachers identify concerning boys and suggest ways that teachers can create a learning environment that supports and engages boys (as well as girls).
