Fri. 10/1/21 8:30 am- 1:30 pm	BSAC (Basic School Age Care Certificate) <b>Note: B.Y.O. snacks/drinks</b>	BSAC (Basic School Age Care) is a 5-hour introductory level training event for school age care professionals that are new to the field. The training includes the following modules: 1) Health, Safety, & Nutrition, 2) Environmental Design, 3) Child/Youth Development 4) Developmentally Appropriate Activities, 5) Guiding Child Behavior, and 6) Quality School Age Care. This training is required by the NC Division of Child Development for school age care professionals working in licensed programs but is a great training for new staff in any afterschool program setting. <b>*** NOTE: BRING YOUR OWN DRINKS/SNACKS SEATED ONLY</b>	5 hrs	\$25
Wed. 10/6/21 & Thurs. 10/7/21 5:30 -9 :00 pm Each night Parts 1&2	Health and Safety Classes Bundle Parts 1 & 2 <b>You have to attend both nights and be on time to class</b>	<b>WHAT THIS CLASS INCLUDES:</b> Prevention and control of infectious diseases, including immunizations; Prevention of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and use of safe sleep practices (Note: This is not the ITS-SIDS class). Administration of medication, with standards for parental consent; Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions; Building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards that can cause bodily injury such as electrical hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic; Emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies resulting from a natural disaster or a mancaused event; Handling and storage of hazardous materials and the appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants; Precautions in transporting children; Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome, Abusive Head Trauma and child maltreatment. <b>***REMINDER: WHAT THIS CLASS DOESN'T INCLUDE:</b> Recognizing and reporting child abuse, child neglect and child maltreatment (Has to be completed ONLINE through <a href="http://preventchildabusenc.org">preventchildabusenc.org</a> website); CPR & First Aid Training (has to be completed every 2 years; ITS-SIDS (has to be completed every 3 years) <b>***SEATED ONLY</b>	7 hrs	\$35
Wed. 10/13/21 4 pm until	CPR/FA	(CPR) Participants will learn lifesaving breathing techniques. (FA) Teaches critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking, or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives. <b>SEATED ONLY</b>	6 hrs	\$75
Thurs. 10/14/21 10 am-12 pm	Let's DISH! DIRECTORS Implementing Social Emotional Health!	Join us for an information-packed session presented by an Education Specialist with NC's Healthy Social Behaviors Initiative that explores the CSEFEL Pyramid model, stresses the importance of social-emotional well-being and reviews resources for directors to share with teachers and parents about understanding and supporting social-emotional development. This is the key to unlocking your center's plan for positive classroom behaviors, school readiness, content parents and happy teachers. <b>Note: This session is intended for Administrators, Directors and FCCH Owners only. Wed. 10/27/21 8:30 am- 2:30 pm	NC FELDS (Foundations)	This five-hour course will provide participants with an introduction to Foundations, North Carolina's new Early Learning and Development expectations, how they are structured, and how to implement them in early childhood settings. <b>***NOTE: WITH 1 HOUR LUNCH BREAK ON YOUR OWN SEATED ONLY</b>	5 hrs= .5 CEU	\$25
Thurs. 10/28/21 6:30-8:30 pm	Change Is Hard! But It Doesn't Have to Hurt!	Experts estimate that 20-30% of a young child's day involves transitioning from one activity to another. That's a lot of moving and a lot of wasted time! Unless teachers plan transitions as carefully and intentionally as they plan the rest of their day, that time can be stressful and frustrating for teachers and children alike. Participants will identify the transitions in their daily schedule, determine ways to eliminate some transitions, and learn strategies to support smooth transitions.
