

NC Pre-K



The NC Pre-Kindergarten Program is a high-quality early childhood program that prepares eligible children for success. Wayne County currently has 32 NC Pre-K classrooms in private child care facilities, public schools, and head start programs. All programs use the Creative Curriculum and plan for play-based learning experiences with activities targeted to meet each child's needs. Children must be four years old by August 31st of the current year and be identified as at risk for poor school outcomes. Risk factors include low household income, limited English proficiency, identified disability, chronic health condition and/or developmental or educational need. Children of active duty military families are also eligible.

Wayne County is still taking applications for the 2019-2020 school year. To apply, please visit <https://pfcw.org/for-parents/nc-pre-k-for-parents/> or visit our office at 800 N. William Street, Goldsboro, NC 27530. We will need income information for parent(s) of the child living in the home as well as the child's birth certificate in order to process the application. Additional documentation requested will include: physical and shot record, and documentation of health concern and/or educational/developmental need. Think Babies



Brains are built, not born. During the first years of life, babies' experiences are built into their bodies - shaping brain development and building the foundation for all future learning, behavior and health. When we support our babies and toddlers in having the opportunity to fulfill their potential, we create the best outcomes in health, education and economic well-being for everyone in North Carolina.

Think Babies NC, funded by the **Pritzker Children's Initiative** and **Zero To Three**, aims to improve outcomes for North Carolina's babies and toddlers and their families. Research demonstrates that when policies and programs ensure healthy beginnings at birth, support families, and make high-quality child care and learning environments more accessible and affordable, young children benefit.

When we support them in their earliest years, we prepare our babies to grow, learn and succeed - and our communities, workforce and economy become stronger and more productive.

The Partnership will be holding a community forum, October 2nd from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. at Wayne Community College to explore and discuss what is happening in Wayne County regarding infants and toddlers. Does your child exhibit CHALLENGING BEHAVIORS? Incredible Years is a FREE positive parenting program dedicated to supporting and strengthening families and preparing them to handle misbehaviors and learn preventive approaches.

The next FREE classes will be starting on August 19th for Spanish group and August 20th for English group. Class meets once a week for 15 weeks from 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm. This class is for parents, grandparents,



Did you know that there have already been 21 pediatric vehicular heatstroke deaths during 2019? A car can heat up 19 degrees in just 10 minutes! To reduce the number of deaths from heatstroke, remember to ACT!


Avoid heatstroke related injury and death by never leaving a child alone in a car, not even for a minute. And make sure to keep your car locked when you are not inside so kids don't get in on their own.

Create reminders. Keep a stuffed animal or other memento in your child's car seat when it's empty and move it to the front seat as a visual reminder when your child is in the back seat. Or... place and secure your phone, briefcase or purse in the backseat
